SEQUENCE FOR TEACHER OF STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES Leading to NJ Teacher of Students with Disabilities Certification

I. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: The master's degree program in special education provides advanced graduate preparation for general education teachers seeking Teacher of Students with Disabilities licensure. NJDOE requires a Standard Instructional Certificate or Certificate of Eligibility with Advanced Standing (CEAS) in a subject area other than English as a Second Language to issue a TOSD certification. Therefore this program is only available to applicants who hold an instructional certificate other than ESL.

Course work addresses the instructional needs of students with mild and moderate disabilities. The 36-credit program is composed of a special education core (21 credits); a learning, cognition, and development (LCD) requirement (3 credits); educational statistics, measurement, and evaluation courses (6 credits); and special education electives (6 credits).

This special education core develops competencies in the assessment and remediation of students with learning disabilities, collaborative teaching/consultation skills, and knowledge about New Jersey special education law.

Students **not** interested in pursuing a master's degree but interested in obtaining the Teaching Students with Disabilities endorsement should apply for admission into the 21 credit non-degree program. A student working on the non-degree program who later decides to be in the master's degree program must seek admission to the degree program prior to completing 12 applicable credits.

II. APPLICATION DEADLINES:

Fall admission - February 1 deadline Spring admission - October 15 deadline Summer admission - May 15 deadline

- **III. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:** To be considered for admission to the program, applicants must provide the following before the deadline:
 - 1. A photocopy of a New Jersey Standard Instructional Certificate or a Certificate of Eligibility with Advanced Standing (CEAS) showing certification other than English as a Second Language.
 - 2. Personal statement
 - 3. Three letters of recommendation*
 - 4. Official undergraduate transcripts

*NOTE: The recommendation requirement is waived for any applicant who has successfully completed at least 15 credits, with a B+ average, in the non-degree Special Education endorsement program.

- IV. HOW TO APPLY: Applications are submitted online at the Graduate Admissions website: http://gradstudy.rutgers.edu/
 - 1. Click on "Create Account or Login" and follow the instructions given.
 - 2. Under "Start an application today!", click **Apply Now** Application Selection
 - 3. For "Level of Application", select Graduate
 - 4. For "Applicant Type", select **Degree**
 - 5. Continue filling out the application, following the on-screen instructions. Program of Study
 - 6. Under "Program Information", make sure **Degree** is selected for "Applicant Type"

- 7. For "Degree Type", select Master's (e.g. MA, MS, EdM, MFA)
- 8. For "Area of Study", select Education
- 9. For "Location/Instructional Method", select **New Brunswick**
- 10. For "Program Selection", select **Education Special Education (EDM) New Brunswick**Program Details
- 11. For "First Preference Concentration", select **Teacher of Students with Disabilities**. (2nd and 3rd preferences can be left blank.)
- 12. Complete the rest of the application by providing the requested information.
- 13. Enter payment information for the non-refundable application fee.
- 14. Submit your application.
