



ED.M. IN SPECIAL EDUCATION WITH ADVANCED CERTIFICATION: LEARNING DISABILITIES TEACHER-CONSULTANT

I. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

The Ed.M. in Special Education with Advanced Licensure: Learning Disability Teacher-Consultant (LDT-C) offered at the GSE provides advanced preparation for certified teachers who wish to work as an assessment specialist and a member of the Pupil Personnel Services team in the New Jersey public school system.

The Ed.M. is intended for educators who already hold a New Jersey Standard Instructional Certificate and three years of full-time teaching experience and wish to work within an elementary or secondary school setting. This advanced degree program does not lead to initial teacher certification.

Candidates in this program take required coursework that leads to New Jersey Department of Education certification as a Learning Disability Teacher-Consultant (LDT-C)

Through completion of the required coursework, students develop knowledge and competencies in the assessment of academic achievement of students referred to for learning disabilities evaluation. Participants will also be prepared to interpret patterns found in testing, devise informal measures to pinpoint cognitive difficulties, and design interventions to help students compensate for academic and behavioral challenges.

II. APPLICATION DEADLINES:

Fall admission - February 1 deadline
Spring admission - October 15 deadline
Summer admission - May 15 deadline

III. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS: To be considered for admission to the program, applicants must provide the following before the deadline:

1. An electronic copy of a New Jersey Standard Instructional Certificate
2. Personal statement
3. One letter of recommendation from the applicant's current or previous supervisor or HR department, on school district letterhead, certifying the completion of **three years** of successful, full-time employment under a New Jersey Standard Instructional Certificate
4. Official undergraduate transcripts

Faculty may be able to waive the prerequisite when one course other than 15:293:522, 293:526, and 293:527 still needs to be completed after the practicum due to scheduling problems.
