ED.M. IN LANGUAGE EDUCATION WITH ADVANCED CERTIFICIATION: BILINGUAL/BICULTURAL EDUCATION (BBE)

Revised April 2025

I. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Ed.M. in Language Education with Advanced Certification: Bilingual/Bicultural Education (BBE) offered at the GSE provides advanced preparation for certified teachers who wish to extend and diversify their professional preparation and seek to enhance their instructional skills and knowledge in bilingual/bicultural education.

The Ed.M. with Advanced Certification: Bilingual/Bicultural Education (BBE) is intended for educators who already hold a New Jersey Standard Instructional Certificate or a Certificate of Eligibility with Advanced Standing (CEAS) and wish to become certified in Bilingual/Bicultural Education (BBE). Students must demonstrate their proficiency in a language other than English to qualify for the New Jersey BBE certification. The program prepares students with a thorough understanding of the nature of language, the process of second language acquisition, the relationship between language and culture, and successful models of multilingual language pedagogy, and the cultural context of language education.

This program does not lead to initial teacher certification. It is intended as an advanced degree and advanced certificate program. Applicants interested in obtaining their initial teaching certification should contact the Office of Student and Academic Services at academic.services@gse.rutgers.edu.

II. APPLICATION DEADLINES:

Fall admission – May 1 deadline Spring admission – December 1 deadline Summer admission – May 1 deadline

- **III. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:** To be considered for admission to the program, applicants must provide the following before the deadline:
 - 1. Personal statement that briefly describes an experience with English language learners and bilingual students and explains why the applicant wishes to enroll in our Bilingual/Bicultural program
 - 2. One letter of recommendation
 - Passing scores on the Oral Proficiency Interview and a Written Proficiency Test in English and in the target language administered by ACTFL.
 (Any test scores submitted must be less than 5 years old as of the application deadline. Scores must be official, not self-reported.)
 - 4. Official undergraduate transcripts. Applicants must hold a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university. Applicants are not usually admitted with a GPA of less than 3.00 in their most recent degree.
 - 5. An electronic copy of a New Jersey Standard Instructional Certificate or CEAS

IV. HOW TO APPLY: Applications are submitted online at the Graduate Admissions website: https://newbrunswickgrad.rutgers.edu/

- 1. Click on "Create Account or Login" and follow the instructions given.
- 2. Under "Start an application today!", click **Apply Now** <u>Application Selection</u>
- 3. For "Level of Application", select Graduate
- 4. For "Applicant Type", select Degree
- 5. Continue filling out the application, following the on-screen instructions.

- 6. Under "Program Information", make sure **Degree** is selected for "Applicant Type"
- 7. For "Degree Type", select Master's (e.g. MA, MS, EdM, MFA)
- 8. For "Area of Study", select Education
- 9. For "Location/Instructional Method", select **New Brunswick**
- 10. For "Program Selection", select Education Language (EDM) New Brunswick <u>Program Details</u>
- 11. For "First Preference Concentration", select **Bilingual/Bicultural Certification**. (2nd and 3rd preferences can be left blank.)
- 12. Complete the rest of the application by providing the requested information.
- 13. Enter payment information for the non-refundable application fee.
- 14. Submit your application.
