



ED.M. WITH ADVANCED LICENSURE IN READING SPECIALIST AND SUPERVISOR

Leading to NJ Early Literacy, Reading Specialist and Supervisor Certifications

Revised Summer 2024 - For students admitted for Fall 2025 or later

- I. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:** The Ed.M. with Advanced Licensure in Reading Specialist and Supervisor program offered at the GSE is designed for certified teachers who wish to work as a reading/literacy specialist, early literacy specialist, coach, basic skills teacher, or supervisor in public and private schools, serving grades PK through 12. Students develop a broad understanding of PK-12 literacy issues and the finer points of designing, delivering, and evaluating effective literacy instruction with a focus on literacy development as a social justice issue. Through research-driven core courses, led by expert faculty, candidates will deepen their understanding of literacy development, the diagnosis and remediation of reading problems, curriculum development, supervised clinical practicum, and supervision of literacy and other programs. Students also study theory and research in the field. Through these experiences, students will develop the expertise to plan programs for children of differing abilities and diverse cultural backgrounds and foster a vision of literacy learning as an active social process in which students become engaged readers with strategies for independent reading.

Upon completion of the first 18 credits of this program, candidates will be eligible for NJ Certification as an Early Literacy Specialist. Upon successful completion of the entire 33 credit Ed.M., candidates will be eligible for NJ state certification in three areas: Early Literacy Specialist, Reading Specialist, and Supervisor.

Eligible Ed.M. with Advanced Licensure in Reading Specialist and Supervisor program applicants must have a New Jersey Standard Instructional Certificate or Certificate of Eligibility with Advanced Standing, as well as a **minimum of two years of successful, full-time employment working as a classroom teacher.**

Upon completion of the master's program and to receive the endorsements, students must have completed **three years full-time employment working as a classroom teacher.**

II. APPLICATION DEADLINES:

Fall admission - February 1 deadline
Spring admission - November 1 deadline
Summer admission - May 15 deadline

III. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS: To be considered for admission to the program, applicants must provide the following before the deadline:

1. A statement of program intent
2. Verification of experience from the applicant's current or previous supervisor or HR department, on school district letterhead, certifying the completion of two years of successful, full-time classroom teaching employment and a New Jersey Standard Instructional Certificate or Certificate of Eligibility with Advanced Standing
3. Official undergraduate transcripts
4. Electronic copy of a New Jersey Standard Instructional Certificate or Certificate of Eligibility with Advanced Standing

(NOTE: Two years of successful, full-time classroom teaching employment are required for admission, but to receive certification, students must have completed **three** years full-time classroom teaching employment.)

10. For "Program Selection", select **Education - Reading Specialist and Supervisor - Certification (EDM) New Brunswick**
11. Complete the rest of the application by providing the requested information.
12. Enter payment information for the non-refundable application fee.
13. Submit your application.
