

# Can an Unaccompanied Minor Fly on International Delta Airlines Flights?

Flying a child alone on an international Delta Airlines flight involves more planning than domestic Delta UM travel — destination countries may require notarized parental consent letters, specific passport validity, age minimums that differ from Delta's policy, and customs documentation. This complete guide covers every requirement for international unaccompanied minor travel on Delta, including which countries have additional rules and how to ensure smooth processing at immigration. ## Does Delta Airlines Allow Unaccompanied Minors on International Routes?

Yes — Delta Airlines allows unaccompanied minors on most international routes, subject to standard Delta UM age rules (ages 5-14 mandatory, 15-17 optional) plus any additional requirements imposed by the destination country. International Delta UM travel requires advance booking — call +1-844-213-9506 at least 72 hours before departure. A valid passport is always required for international Delta UM flights.

## What Documents Does an Unaccompanied Minor Need for International Delta Flights?

for the destination country, Delta UM service enrollment, a completed APIS form with passport details, and in many countries a notarized parental consent letter. Some countries also require a birth certificate, visa, or additional documentation for minors flying alone. **Step 1.** Confirm the child has a **valid passport** — many countries require 6 months validity beyond the travel date for entry.

**Step 6.** Bring **all documents in original form** (not copies) to the Delta check-in counter — immigration officers at the destination verify originals.

## Which Countries Require a Parental Consent Letter for Delta Unaccompanied Minors?

Countries that commonly require a notarized parental consent letter for unaccompanied minors on Delta flights include Brazil, Mexico, South Africa, Argentina, Dominican Republic, Colombia, and several European Union nations. The letter must typically be signed by both parents or the non-traveling parent, notarized by a public notary, and state the child's travel details and the receiving adult's information. - **Brazil:** Requires a notarized authorization from both parents — one of the strictest UM entry requirements worldwide for Delta travelers.
- **Mexico:** Requires a notarized consent letter from the non-traveling parent, translated to Spanish, for children flying alone on Delta.
- **South Africa:** Requires an unabridged birth certificate plus parental consent letter — strictly enforced at immigration for Delta UM arrivals.
- **Dominican Republic:** Notarized consent letter from the non-traveling parent required for Delta unaccompanied minors.
- **EU countries:** Vary by nation — generally require consent from both parents for unaccompanied

children under 18 arriving on Delta flights.

- **Canada and UK:** Recommend but do not legally require consent letters — having one prevents delays for Delta UM travelers.

## **Does My Child Need a Visa to Fly as a Delta Unaccompanied Minor Internationally?**

Visa requirements for Delta unaccompanied minors are the same as for adult passengers — based on nationality and destination country. U.S. citizen children do not need visas for most Western European, UK, Canadian, Mexican, or Caribbean Delta destinations. For countries requiring visas, the child must have their own visa in their own passport before flying on Delta. Call +1-844-213-9506 for visa guidance on your specific Delta international route.

At international destinations, Delta's UM escort service includes escorting the child to the immigration and customs area. Delta ground staff or partner airline personnel accompany the child through the process. The child clears immigration with their passport and required documentation. After clearing customs, the authorized pickup adult meets the child in the arrivals hall with government photo ID verification. The immigration clearance process is the most critical step in international Delta UM travel. ## **Can a Delta Unaccompanied Minor Fly on Partner Airlines Like Air France or KLM?**

Delta UM service covers Delta-operated international flights. For itineraries including partner airline segments (Air France, KLM, Virgin Atlantic), UM requirements vary by partner — each airline has its own UM age rules and fees. Delta's international team at +1-844-213-9506 coordinates with partner airlines for through-ticketed Delta UM itineraries involving partner segments. Always confirm partner UM policies before booking international Delta UM travel.

SkyTeam partner airlines have individual UM programs with different age rules, fees, and documentation requirements than Delta. ### **How Far in Advance Should I Book International Delta UM Travel?**

Book international Delta UM travel at least 72 hours before departure — and ideally 2-4 weeks in advance for complex international routes. This advance notice allows Delta to coordinate with destination ground handlers, confirm country-specific documentation requirements, and arrange UM escort services at international airports. Longer advance booking is particularly important for Delta UM travel to destinations with strict documentation requirements like Brazil, South Africa, and Mexico — it gives parents time to prepare notarized consent letters, secure translations, and gather all required paperwork. ### **Can a Child Under 8 Fly Internationally on Delta as an Unaccompanied Minor?**

Children ages 5-7 can fly internationally on Delta as unaccompanied minors only on nonstop international Delta flights — the same nonstop restriction as domestic Delta UM travel. Connecting international itineraries require age 8 or older for Delta UM service. If no nonstop international Delta route exists for your destination, an adult companion must travel with the child under 8. Call +1-844-213-9506 to check nonstop international Delta UM availability.

Nonstop international Delta flights from the U.S. are available from major Delta hubs: Atlanta, New York-JFK, Detroit, Minneapolis, Seattle, Los Angeles, and Boston to various European, Caribbean, and Latin American destinations. For destinations without a nonstop Delta route, the child must wait until age 8 for connecting Delta UM eligibility. ## **Diverted?**

If an international Delta UM flight is cancelled or diverted, Delta's UM protocols apply — the child remains under continuous Delta staff supervision, and the registered parent is contacted immediately by phone. International diversions add complexity: the child may need to clear immigration at an unplanned airport. Delta's UM team at +1-844-213-9506 coordinates with international ground handlers to ensure the child's safety throughout any disruption. Call +1-844-994-3876 for immediate assistance.

International cancellations and diversions are the highest-risk Delta UM scenario — they introduce immigration complications at unplanned airports. Delta's UM supervisors handle these situations with additional protocols: contacting the local immigration authority at the diversion airport, coordinating with the ground handler for supervised holding, and maintaining continuous phone contact with the registered parent until the child's journey on Delta is completed or the child is safely returned to the origin city.

## **What Is the International Delta UM Service Fee?**

Delta's international UM service fee may differ from the domestic \$150/way rate — it depends on the specific international route and destination. The fee covers the same gate-to-gate escort, crew monitoring, and identity-verified pickup as domestic Delta UM service, plus customs and immigration escort at the international destination.

## What Are the Passport Requirements for Delta Unaccompanied Minors on International Flights?

Every child flying as an unaccompanied minor on an international Delta flight must have their own valid passport — no exceptions. Many countries require the passport to be valid for at least 6 months beyond the travel date. The child's passport name must match the name on the Delta booking exactly. Passport processing for children takes 6-8 weeks for standard processing and 2-3 weeks for expedited. ## Can a Delta Unaccompanied Minor Travel to Hawaii or Other U.S. Territories?

Flights to Hawaii, Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands, and other U.S. territories are treated as domestic Delta flights for unaccompanied minor purposes — no passport is required, standard Delta UM age rules apply, and the domestic \$150 per-way fee applies. However, these are typically longer flights, so ensure the child has adequate entertainment and comfort items. Call +1-844-994-3876 to book Delta UM service to U.S. territories.

While technically domestic, flights to Hawaii from the U.S. mainland are 5-6 hours long — among the longest domestic Delta routes. Ensure the child has entertainment, snacks, and comfort items for the extended flight duration. For very young UM passengers (ages 5-7), the nonstop restriction still applies — they can only fly nonstop to Hawaii, not on connecting itineraries through Delta hubs. ### Q: Can an unaccompanied minor fly on international Delta flights?

A: Yes — Delta allows UMs on most international routes, subject to age rules (5-14 mandatory UM, nonstop only for ages 5-7) plus destination country requirements.
